AN ORDINANCE AWARDDING A NONEXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE TO _____ TO PROVIDE RESIDENTIAL CURBSIDE RECYCLING COLLECTIONS IN THE CITY OF STREETSBORO, FOR A PERIOD OF FOUR YEARS, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A FRANCHISE AGREEMENT.

MOTION: TO ADD PORTAGE COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT INTO THE BLANK SPACE.

Moved by Mr. Ruediger, seconded by Mr. Allen. Mayor Broska asked Mr. Ruediger how he could do that and cost the citizens of Streetsboro \$70,000 over the next four years; why? what's the purpose of that? Mr. Ruediger said wouldn't it be saving the City money? Mayor Broska said Mr. Ruediger had seen the comparison where Kimble would charge \$3.60/week for weekly standard recycling pickup and Portage County was \$4.96/week; a difference of \$1.36/week. And the City had to pay for 1,200+ people under the Senior program. Mr. Ruediger noted that there was a Senior rate quote of \$2.10 from Portage County, but Mayor Broska pointed out that it was only good if it was bi-weekly service for everyone and if the contract was extended to six years. Mr. Ruediger thought it would lock in a better price for a longer time. Mayor Broska emphasized that the people didn't want bi-weekly service, they wanted weekly pickup. With Kimble there would be a savings of \$76,704/year or \$306,816 over the 4 year contract. Mr. Ruediger said with a six year contract with Portage County that number would drop significantly, but Mayor Broska said that would be for bi-weekly service and the people wanted weekly service. Mrs. Pavlick commented that the ordinance was for a 4 year contract although Mr. Ruediger was basing his decision on a six year contract. Mr. Allen said he seconded the motion for Portage County Solid Waste Management because it would lock in the rate for six years. He also said when you look at the communities that Kimble had other than just around Streetsboro they were much more, they were way inflated and when Portage County was out of the recycling game, the prices would get inflated. He said if commodities went down as Kimble stated, the private haulers were not subsidized to keep recycling as Portage County was. He mentioned comparing the rates factoring in that Kimble would only provide 65 gallon containers and charge for any additional containers, but Portage County would give 65 gallon or 96 gallon containers free/no charge and an extra one no charge if it was wanted, if someone were to get two containers from Kimble they would be paying more than the Portage County rate, so it was actually cheaper in the long run. But Mayor Broska emphasized it would only be bi-weekly service.

Mr. Allen said the big money was the generation fee, which the representative from Kimble spoke about last time and said the only way we could minimize that was to go to the meetings and to try to beat up on that and the only way we could beat up on that was if Portage County was making money, and the generation fee cost us hundreds of thousands of dollars. He wanted to stay with Portage County and called for the vote. Upon roll call to award the franchise agreement to Portage County Solid Waste Management District, **motion failed 3-2**: Mr. Ruediger-Yes, Mr. Allen-Yes, Ms. Timmons-Yes, Mrs. Field-No, Mrs. Pavlick-No.

MOTION: TO INSERT KIMBLE INTO THE BLANK SPACE OF THE LEGISLATION.

Moved by Mrs. Field, seconded by Mrs. Pavlick. Upon roll call, **motion failed 2-3**: Mrs. Field-Yes, Mrs. Pavlick-Yes, Mr. Allen-No, Ms. Timmons-No, Mr. Ruediger-No. The blank space would remain in the legislation. Mr. Allen commented that last Monday he spent an hour picking up trash on Valley Brook Road for the fourth time since he'd been on City Council for an elderly walk up customer of Kimble because Kimble dumped the trash and didn't pick it up. Mr. Allen thought there would be more of this if Kimble provided the walk up service for free. The Clerk read by title as directed.
