Moved by Mr. Ruediger, seconded by Mr. Allen. Upon roll call, **motion carried 5-2 with Mr. Ruediger and Mr. Allen opposing the motion.** Mr. Ruediger didn't think Streetsboro should be trying to keep businesses out of the City. He added that if rezoning was wanted, it had been nearly a year to get this done since this was enacted in the State, so he voted no. Mr. Allen also thought there had been enough time.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Broska reported that the paving program was just about done for the year. The rebuilding of Fairacres Avenue had come out great with 7 inches of new asphalt and new curbs and gutters. He thanked Council for authorizing the additional money to get this taken care of. He told Council that Fronek Road was originally built at the same time as Fairacres Avenue and would probably need the same type of extensive repair when it came time to repave Fronek Road, so Council should expect that extra expense. He added that Frost Road and Diagonal Road paving was also finishing up but still needed striping. Those road were very nice now, so people should be careful and watch their speed on those roads.

He said Happy Indigenous People Day for those that didn't want to recognize Columbus Day.

President of Council's Comments

Mr. Michniak said Happy Columbus Day for the Italians that wanted to recognize Columbus.

Council Members' Comments

Mr. Ruediger gave an example of a child that might be seen on the Live PD TV show and then get bullied by classmates which could lead to a suicide. This would be an extreme worst case example, but there were likely to be children visible to the cameras as the police interacted with the parents in a car or at a home, which could easily lead to bullying of the children. He added that a victim of assault (sexual or otherwise) would not want their business aired on national TV, so that should be avoided. He said Go Tribe!

Mr. Michniak said he often dealt with sexual assault victims in his Prosecutor job and he always tried to tell them that there was nothing shameful in being a victim of a crime. People often tend to label victims of sexual assault different than other victims and that was something that needed to change. No victim of a crime wanted to be shown on TV at that vulnerable time, it was

embarrassing, but the public needed to rethink how they thought of victims, even children that were victims. The victims and the public needed to realize the victim did nothing wrong, it was the other person that committed the crime and was at fault. The more the public would blame the perpetrators and the less stigma the public would place on the victims, the better it would be for the victims of sexual assault, especially children. The victim of a sexual assault shouldn't be thought of as a different kind of victim; they were no different than a person that got stabbed or robbed or shot; they had no say in what was done to them.

Reports/Communications from Dept/Boards/Commissions

Mr. Mytinger said the Trick or Treat Trot 5K race would be Sunday morning, October 29, 2017. The new course route would start and end at City Hall and runners were encouraged to dress in costume. Trunk or Treat would be Thursday, October 26, 2017 at Walmart and there were still spaces left for organizations to hand out candy.

Chief Powers commented that he and the rest of the Police Department were very cognizant of Mr. Ruediger's concerns and would work very hard to make sure the producers were cognizant also to avoid any situations Mr. Ruediger had mentioned. Chief Powers said if he saw that there was something that was going to be a problem, he would pull the plug. He wanted Mr. Ruediger to know he wasn't taking Mr. Ruediger's concerns lightly because he also wouldn't want anything bad to result from this Live PD show. The purpose was to highlight the City's officers and not to put anyone in any of the situations Mr. Ruediger had mentioned.
